Join the Anglers, Conservationists and Teachers of Trout Unlimited for a 5-day Trout Camp



The future of conservation lies with our youth and developing their love of the outdoors. Trout Camp emphasizes ethics, etiquette and streamside environment along with the joy of fly fishing for children aged 10-13.

Schedule

Our 5-day camp combines 2 days of day-camp and an overnight fishing trip:
August 2, 3 – 9:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. – MK Nature Center, Walnut Street, Boise;
August 4, 5, 6 – trip to Dutch Creek Guard Station on the Middle Fork of the Boise River for more fishing, instruction and the joy of the sport.

Curriculum

Trout Camp will teach the sport of fly fishing (for both novice and experienced anglers) in an ethical manner, with emphasis on the natural resources that make the sport possible. We teach respect for the environment and the understanding that successful angling and conservation of the resource go hand in hand. Most important, we teach your child that getting outdoors and into a stream or river is FUN!

This year we are adding a leadership component for previous camp attendees. Those who attended last year's Camp and are at least 12 years old at the start of this year's camp are eligible to be Leaders in Training. These campers will be given additional responsibilities (but well within their abilities) to help the camp run smoothly, and to ensure that all campers have fun. There will be a maximum of 4 Leaders in Training (2 boys, 2 girls), but previous attendees are also welcome to apply for regular camp selection as well.

Overnight Trip

Our overnight trip will be based at the Dutch Creek Guard Station on the Middle Fork of the Boise River. Children will stay in groups in large tents with adult supervision.

Supplies and Equipment

Trout Camp provides all the flyfishing equipment your child needs, though he or she is free to use their own, also. Children will arrive each day dressed and equipped for both indoor and outdoor activities. For our trip to the Middle Fork your child needs a sleeping bag and appropriate clothes. A complete equipment list will be provided.

Safety and Security

The safety and security of your child at Trout Camp is our top priority. All adults (instructors, “guides,” assistants) who might be responsible for your child have undergone a thorough background check. All instructors are experienced anglers, and we’ve enlisted professional educators to lead our program. Parents are encouraged to attend and to volunteer to help make Trout Camp as safe and successful as possible.

Costs

Tuition cost is \$275 per child. Upon receiving notice that your child has been selected, we require a deposit of \$100, with the balance due 2 weeks before camp. Partial scholarships are available for those unable to pay the full tuition.



To Apply

We expect more applications than we have seats.
